The general prevalence of westerly winds, blowing with great violence, make it difficult to approach: but the sudden changes in the weather from a calm to a storm, and from heat to cold, often render a shipwreck only the beginning of sorrows: the dangers of the sea are even less fatal than the wintry perils of the shore. The mariner wants all his prudence in exercise when drawing near to this inhospitable coast. But prudence without Providence is an imperfect guide. A belief in the interposition of Divine Providence in our behalf is a most delightful part of true religion: that the very hairs of our head are all numbered, and that not a sparrow falleth to the ground without our father, is most consoling. (Matt. 10. 29.) Those who know this will find no difficulty in believing that the sufferings as well as the safety of this company of rational and immortal beings were attentively considered and particularly provided for by the same paternal power. It is certainly rational to believe that he who has wisdom enough to create even the minutest forms of life, has goodness enough to preserve and that He who directs the flight of a bird, directed the flight of that little boat over the boisterous waves, and conducted it to the desired haven: and if this view of human affairs is rational and scriptural, it is no less delightful.
